Coach's XI Triumph

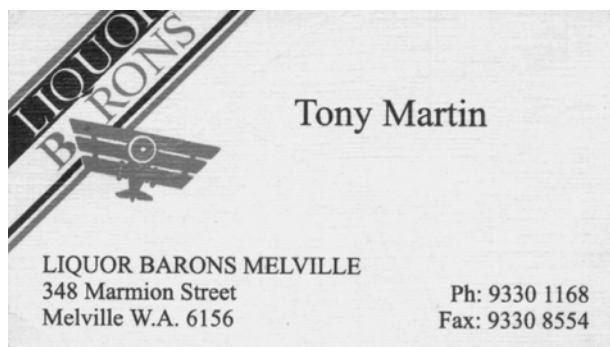

Steel Fencing Auction

One of our sponsors, BHP Steel Lysaght, has extended its cash contribution by donating about 35 meters of Lysaght Steel Fencing (Neetascreen). Our very own Glenn Strother has boosted the value of the package to around \$2,000 by offering to install the fencing in nearby suburbs (except for cement costs for footings). The Neetascreen donation includes full 1800mm high sheets, posts, rails, screws, post caps (the lot in other words) in any of the popular standard colour combinations.

If the bids exceed the Committee's reserve price, the highest bid will win the fence at our September 8 Medal Count/AGM. Bids will be accepted right up to and on the day. By the way the current listed bid is still well below our reserve price.

Even if you don't need a new fence, think about a friend or colleague who does and put in a bid for them. This is a great way for us to raise some \$\$ for the club and you will probably never get a fence this cheap again. If you need more than 35 meters, Lysaght are willing to discount the remainder and Glenn will negotiate for the extra installation too.

GROUND RULES

Teams playing on Stevens Reserve must observe the following rules:
