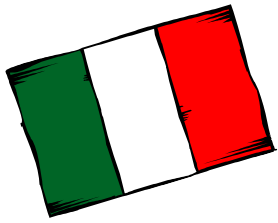

# Italian Champions

Former Magpie Peter Blakeney became one of a rare few in world sport as he became a national champion in three different countries as he helped HC de Sisti Roma to the Italian Serie A title, adding to prior victories in Australia with the Western Australian Thundersticks and in Ireland with Three Rock Rovers in 2008.



The Dubliner played a key role in his club's 2-1 final win over HC Bra to hand his club their sixth national title, registering the assist for Luca Settimi's 57th minute winner. Blakeney agreed to join the Italian club in the spring for the second half of their season on a semi-professional basis. Fremantle's Tasmanian recruit Phil Marshall also represented the Italians on their march to glory.

Marshall & Blakeney were cheered on in the final by Roma's favourite son, Francesco Totti, whose football club is an affiliate of the hockey club. Blakeney becomes the first Irish hockey player to achieve the feat of three national titles in different countries despite the Irish ably picking up titles in Europe in the past decade.

## Hockey Battling For Survival?

*In recent months I have, either formally or informally, been able to view a number of hockey "case studies". They cover the full spectrum of hockey from school, club, university, technikon, province, state, district, national and continental.*

*Sadly my conclusion is that in far too many cases hockey is battling for survival – virtually on a life-boat bobbing on a sea where the wind, waves and sharks, borne of the pressure of a lack of resources, are buffeting the loyal band (of largely voluntary) administrators. I watch schools hockey and am perturbed at the overall approach across the full spectrum of school teams and the superficiality of coaching and preparation.*

*The loss of players after leaving school is enormous. Clubs are by and large battling for survival and there has been a shrinking of the number of club teams – certainly here in South Africa. Provincial Hockey administration is threadbare and under constant pressure – often just keeping their finger in the dike like the Dutch legend – rather than longer term planning.*

*The quality of umpiring in lower leagues is often something which raises serious concerns and tensions amongst players. The majority of National Associations can hardly keep the wolf from the door as their international team programmes consume the majority of their budgets leaving the average league players disgruntled that they are not receiving value for levies or subscriptions paid and demanding a bigger piece of the pie.*

*Many National Associations are run primarily by volunteers or a combination of a small full time staff*

*and volunteers – all massively dependent on Government grants. This puts them at the whim of politicians who often force issues upon these Associations. The Continental Federations have vast hockey territories to administer – expensive, arduous and complex, as there are language differences, vast distances to travel, and varying standards of communication, and of course vastly differing local conditions and resources.*

*Hockey has to come up with innovative plans to break this stranglehold and despite the excellent work of the Development and Coaching Committee of the FIH and the Continental Development Officers, new ideas to assist Continental Federations and National Associations have to be devised and effectively implemented. Greater assistance needs to be given to break the vicious circle of mere survival – the "Treadmill syndrome". We need to give our members, the National Associations as much support as possible.*

*In fact, we need to enhance and intensify this support!*

*For hockey to gain "market" share in the World of Sport, the FIH's new Strategic Planning must be completed and urgently implemented to increase income threefold! Resources must rapidly flow to key strategic projects. It is no longer just a dream but an absolute necessity!*

## Hurtz gets winner in 3 test series opener

The Ireland Ladies hockey team were beaten 1-0 by Australia in the first of a three-match series at UCD on Wednesday. The Irish had clearly managed to shake off the memories of their 6-0 defeat against India three days ago in Germany and came out looking composed and comfortable on the ball.

It was the Australian's who got the first crack of the whip winning a penalty corner in the ninth minute but their direct shot flew wide. Ireland responded within two minutes creating their first real attack when Audrey O'Flynn linked up with Nikki Symmons who fed through to Niamh Small on the left wing but her cross went unanswered across the goal.

Ireland had their best chance of the half in the 22nd minute when Eimear Cregan stole the ball from the defender creating a one on one with the keeper but she was pushed wide and her reverse shot at a tight angle went wide of the target. The stalemate did not last long into the second half when Ireland were turned over on the Australian 25 which led to a two-pass counter attack setting up Emily Hurtz to crack the ball home to score the only goal of the match.

Ireland finally attacked with seven minutes left on the clock when Julia O'Halloran made a great cross for Nikki Symmons who fired a cross through the Australian circle, but the pass skimmed across the oncoming Irish sticks. ## Last minute goal gives Hockeyroos tournament win

### Hockeyroos 1 Germany 1 (0-0 half time)

Goals – Ger Catherine Otte 43m PC, Aus Ashleigh Nelson 70m FG

A goal to Hockeyroos striker Ashleigh Nelson with only 10 seconds remaining has seen Australia draw with Germany and win the 4 nations tournament in Essen, Germany. Needing at least a draw to win the tournament after dominating Ireland and India in earlier matches, the result was justified for the Hockeyroos who had numerous scoring opportunities throughout the match, including 10 penalty corners, but left it until the dying stages to convert.

Fittingly it was Nelson who scored the tournament winning goal for the Hockeyroos, with the West Australian striker under an injury cloud entering the tournament due to an ankle injury. It was her second goal of the tournament in which she was arguably the Hockeyroos most consistent performer.

With neither team able to score in the first half, it was Germany who opened the scoring eight minutes after half time via a penalty corner to Catherine Otte. The Hockeyroos remained in the match and had their share of opportunities to score, but in the dying stages it appeared that Germany would hold onto their 1-0 lead.

However a lapse in concentration saw Nelson made the most of her opportunity, scoring with only 10 seconds remaining to level the match and hand the Hockeyroos a much deserved tournament victory, made even more significant given key players Kate Hollywood and Casey Eastham did not compete due to injury which could derail their World Cup and Commonwealth Games campaigns.

Captain Madonna Blyth, Kate Jenner, Kobie McGurk and Jayde Taylor were amongst Australia's best players. The Hockeyroos will now travel to Ireland to play three test matches and continue their preparations for the World Cup and Commonwealth Games later in the year. *Hockey Australia Media Report*

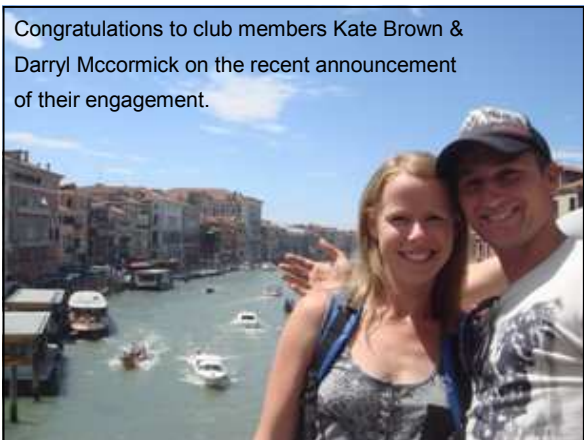

Congratulations to Kookaburra and current Magpie, Nicole Arroll, who has recently gained her 200th international cap for the Australian women's team. Nic's milestone achievement came on 27th June 2010 during the sides 3-0 test series victory over Ireland and cements her status as one of the worlds leading players.

Her international debut came in 2001 at the KT Cup in Korea and since then Nic has gone onto represent Australia in numerous Champions Trophy tournaments; World Cup's; Commonwealth and Olympic games. She is a vital member of the team's defensive unit.
